

Police Department

The Barrington Police Department is comprised of 24 sworn police officers and six civilian men and women who are dedicated to preserving the rights, property, safety and dignity of the people of this community. UNIFORM DIVISION

Twenty-two uniformed police officers responded to approximately 26,878 calls for service, handled 1,482 incident reports, made 301 criminal arrests, stopped 4,206 motor vehicles, investigated 425 accidents, issued 1,314 citations, and gave out 2,892 verbal warnings during FY-2015.



ANIMAL CONTROL

Animal Control received over 851 calls for animal control service ranging from loose dogs and cats, wild animals, animal cruelty and barking dog complaints. Animal Control filed 60 formal reports and issued 61 summons in FY-2014.

DETECTIVE DIVISION

The Department is staffed with only two full time detectives, Lt. Dino DeCrescenzo and Det. Ben Ferreira, who investigated and solved dozens of felony and misdemeanor cases.



COMMUNITY RELATIONS



During the year, patrol officers logged over 549 different Community Policing/Relations efforts throughout the town. These contacts include speaking to business employees/owners in the Barrington Shopping Center, walkers on the East Bay Bike Path, Town Beach, and stopping by our schools and playgrounds. Cub Scout and Brownie Troop tours at the Police Station usually occur monthly.
