Learn more about Barrington's architectural legacy and its history! The Barrington Preservation Society (BPS) will present three more historic plaques to homeowners on Wednesday, December 6<sup>th</sup>, in the Public Library, GALLERY 2nd floor. These three turn-of-the-century homes are over 100 years old, reflect the original designs of their period and do not have artificial siding. The BPS distinctive, oval, hand-lettered plaque shows the name of the original owner and date of construction. All three have additions, which are reflected in the use of "et seq," a Latin abbreviation used in identifying additions.

Houses and owners to be honored this year are:

- 1) 60 Alfred Drown Road, **Nathaniel & Jane Hazard House, ca.1890 et seq.** Owners: Stephen and Patty Lang, This beautiful Queen Anne Victorian house has an elaborate decorative treatment of the upper facade.
- 2) 53 Alfred Drown Road. **Frank R. Chadwick House, ca. 1896 et seq.** Owners: John and Elaine Boyajian. This house is an elegant, Dutch Colonial Revival design with a gambrel roof and shed-roof dormers. Its deep rear garden extends to Allin's Cove.
- 2) 379 New Meadow Road. **Robert Wilde House, 1902 et seq.** Owners: Jack and Kathy Beauchamp. This charming Colonial Revival cottage has a projecting entry and a doorway with a fanlight. The site was a "woodlot" for a Drownville owner for many years.
