The Town of Barrington assures that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, sex, disability, income status or national origin as provided by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity. The Town of Barrington further assures every effort will be made to ensure nondiscrimination in all of its programs and activities, whether those programs and activities are federally funded or not.

The Town's first full compliance review was in February 1998. The Town continually strives to ensure compliance at all times.

The Town further agrees to the following responsibilities with respect to its programs and activities:

- Designate two Title VI Liaisons that have a responsible position within the organization and access to the Town Manager. - Conduct annual nondiscrimination training on Title VI for all Department Heads and Staff.

• Ensure all programs and activities are available to all citizens regardless of race, color, sex, disability, income status or national origin.

The Town of Barrington's Title VI Program's primary goal is to ensure all management, staff, contractors, local agencies and service beneficiaries are aware of the provisions of Title VI and the responsibilities associated with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

The Town of Barrington's Program is responsible for providing leadership, direction and policy to ensure compliance with Title VI and to ensure that social impacts to communities and people are recognized and considered throughout the planning and decision making process.

Making a Title VI Complaint

Any person who believes he or she has been aggrieved by an unlawful discriminatory practice under Title VI may file a complaint with Peter DeAngelis, the Town Manager.
